



Revised Notice of Public Hearing

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) announces a new date for Hearing Day Two on the application by Atomic Energy of Canada Limited (AECL) to renew its Nuclear Research and Test Establishment Operating Licence for the Chalk River Laboratories (CRL) located in Chalk River, Ontario. AECL has requested a five-year licence term. Hearing Day One was held on June 8, 2011 in Ottawa, Ontario.

Day Two of the public hearing will take place on October 4 and 5 instead of October 5 and 6, 2011, as originally announced.

The renewed operating licence would allow the continued operation of the nuclear facilities at CRL, including the National Research Universal (NRU) Reactor and a number of waste management facilities. The operating licence would also allow the continued operation of radioisotope laboratories and the continued decommissioning of five shutdown nuclear facilities.

The public hearing will be webcasted live on the Internet via the CNSC Web site and archived for a period of 90 days.

The public is invited to comment on AECL's application. Requests to intervene must be filed with the Secretary of the Commission by September 6, 2011 directly on-line at <http://www.nuclearsafety.gc.ca/eng/commission/intervention> or at the coordinates below. Pursuant to the *Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission Rules of Procedure*, **the request must include the following information:**

- a written submission of the comments to be presented to the Commission;
- a statement setting out whether the requester wishes to intervene by way of written submission only or by way of written submission and oral presentation; and
- name, address and telephone of the requester.

Personal information, such as address and telephone numbers, is essential for linking the submission to its author. Please submit your personal information on a separate page if you wish

to ensure its confidentiality. It should be noted that all submissions are available to the public upon request to the Secretariat.
